

Designer Brian Graham draws inspiration from the structures of the modern built environment to create Span, a simple platform designed to support a broad range of functional elements including seating, storage or a tabletop. The platform is anchored by a welded stainless steel base composed of refined forms with architectural reference points. As a basis for seating, Span emphasizes the contrast of soft and hard, of tailored cushions resting on a bridge of steel. However deployed, the design makes reference to classic architectural features—and the dialogue between the support and the supported—in a distinctly modern manner.

"Everything is designed," notes Brian Graham who, conversely, designs almost everything. Perhaps best known for elegant casegoods and office furniture systems, Graham is involved in a wide range of genres, consulting across disciplines and crafting integrated design programs for his clients.

Graham received a BFA in Interior Architectural Design at California State University, Long Beach. He established the Graham Design studio in San Francisco, to offer a strategic approach to the design, development and marketing of furniture, lighting and related products for the contract, residential and hospitality markets.
